

This 2.5 mile (4 km) circular walk leads through recently planted woodland at Pound Farm and the fields and woods of Parham's Oak Farm to reveal fascinating glimpses into England's history.

From a right royal Tudor tale to traditional woodland ways, these living, working landscapes have many time-honoured secrets to share:

- Follow in the footsteps of Mary Tudor and her loyal army of thousands, along the remains of the very route taken on her famous journey from Framlingham Castle to London to claim the throne of England in July 1553.
- Find out about coppicing an ancient form of woodland management still being practised in Queen Mary's Wood today.

• See the mighty oaks of Queen Mary's Plantation sown in Victorian times by the children of the

parish.


